

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE CONFINEMENT OR LEASHING
OF DOGS WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF LIVERMORE

ORDINANCE NO. 6-90

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LIVERMORE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The owner or keeper of every dog within the boundaries of the City of Livermore shall at all times keep such dog:

A. Confined within an enclosure from which he cannot escape, or

B. Firmly secured by means of a collar and chain or other device so that it cannot stray beyond the premises on which it is secured, or

C. Under the control by leash of some person.

2. As used in this Ordinance:

A. The term "dog" means any member of the canine family.

B. The term "owner", includes every person having a right of property in the dog and every person who keeps or harbors the dog, or has it in his care, or permits it to remain on or about the premises owned or occupied by him.

3. Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined the sum of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00. Each day that a dog is permitted to run at large, shall constitute a separate offense.

This ORDINANCE is to be in full force and effect after its passage and publication according to law.
