# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LIVERMORE, KENTUCKY

## CONCEALED WEAPONS PROHIBITED IN BUILDINGS OWNED, LEASED OR CONTROLLED BY THE CITY OF LIVERMORE

#### ORDINANCE NO. 3-04

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and desirable as a matter of the public welfare and safety that the City of Livermore establish a ordinance regarding concealed weapons;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LIVERMORE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

#### SECTION I.

- (A) No person, including employees of the City of Livermore, shall carry a concealed deadly weapon into or on any building or portion of a building owned, leased or controlled by the City of Livermore, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance.
  - (B) Exemptions mandated by state law:
- 1. This ordinance shall not apply to buildings or portions of buildings owned, leased or controlled by the City of Livermore which are used for public housing by private persons and private dwellings.
- 2. This ordinance shall not apply to sworn officers of the City of Livermore, and other law enforcement officers authorized to carry concealed deadly weapons pursuant to KRS 527.020.
- (C) The City of Livermore shall post signs at the entrances of all City-owned, leased or controlled buildings or portions of buildings which shall read as follows:

## CARRYING OF CONCEALED DEADLY WEAPONS ON THESE PREMISES IS PROHIBITED BY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LIVERMORE.

- (D) Violation of this ordinance may result in denial of entry to the building or portion of the building, or an order to leave the building or portion of the building, or, if an employee of the City of Livermore, disciplinary measures up to and including dismissal from employment.
- (E) Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed as permitting the carrying of a concealed deadly weapon in violation of KRS 527.020.

### SECTION IL

All Ordinances or parts thereof, insofar as same may be in conflict herewith, are repealed, and this Ordinance is to be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and publication according to law
